

What You Need to Know About Food License Changes in Philadelphia

- Under a new law passed in December 2017, City of Philadelphia food licenses have changed. Philadelphia will now issue "Large Establishment" food licenses to businesses with 30 or more customer seats and "Small Establishment" food licenses to businesses with 29 or fewer customer seats.
- For a business to qualify for a Large Establishment food license, the 30 seats, and at least one toilet room and a sink, must be regularly available for customer use.
- Businesses with between 30 and 49 seats will be required to schedule a visit from a City inspector to make sure that they are issued the correct license.
- The City will notify businesses with food licenses about the changes and how to comply with the new license law.
- The new law does <u>not</u> affect the use of plexiglass barriers in businesses that sell food and have 29 or fewer seats.
- The new law does <u>not</u> require the immediate removal of plexiglass barriers in businesses that sell food and have 30 or more seats.
- After July 1, 2018, the City will convene a diverse group of stakeholders to consider the use or removal of plexiglass barriers in businesses with 30 or more seats ("Large Establishment" license-holders).
